On behalf of Grain Trade Australia (GTA), it is my pleasure to welcome you to AGIC 2026.

This year marks an important milestone with the inaugural AGIC Week, reflecting the growing importance of collaboration, knowledge sharing and international engagement across our industry. AGIC has long been recognised as Australia's premier grain event, bringing together growers, traders, exporters, processors, logistics providers, researchers, government and customers from around the world.

We are delighted to welcome delegates from across Australia and around the world, including international delegations from China, India, the Philippines, Malaysia, Vietnam and Indonesia.

With the support of Austrade, AGIC has expanded beyond the two-day conference to AGIC Week, creating additional opportunities for international engagement and industry collaboration. The theme for AGIC 2026, **Thriving Today, Resilient Tomorrow**, reflects the environment in which our industry operates. Australian grain continues to make a significant contribution to the economy, with the 2025/26 grain crop valued by ABARES at \$27.7 billion, production estimated at 72.6 million tonnes and exports forecast at more than 49.4 million tonnes valued at around \$23 billion.

While the industry continues to navigate challenges including higher input costs, global energy market disruption and evolving supply chain pressures, the Australian grain sector continues to demonstrate resilience and adaptability.

The achievements of our industry rely on an efficient and trusted self-regulated supply chain supported by the contracts, Trading Rules, dispute resolution processes and standards developed by GTA. AGIC 2026 marks the official launch of the Grain Storage Asset Management Standard (GSAMS), the latest evolution of GTA's Self-Regulatory Framework. Developed over five years in collaboration with the Australian Department of Agriculture, Fisheries & Forestry (DAFF), GSAMS is a strong example of what can be achieved when industry and government work together.

Productivity and innovation remain key priorities for GTA and the broader industry. We continue to support industry on issues including proposed phosphine workplace exposure limits and emerging technologies, including biotechnology, machine learning and artificial intelligence, through our *Market Choice Framework for GM Crops*, *Stewardship Framework for New Technologies* and international engagement.

This year also marks 35 years of GTA. Over that time, GTA has played a central role in facilitating grain trade through industry standards, contracts, dispute resolution and self-regulation, supporting confidence in the quality, reliability and integrity of Australian grain.

I acknowledge the contribution of GTA's Board Directors, Technical Committees, Working Groups and volunteers, whose expertise and commitment continue to support our work and the broader industry.

Thank you to our AGIC speakers, sponsors and partners, particularly HFW, our long-standing gold sponsor, and to the GTA team for delivering AGIC Week and AGIC 2026.

I encourage all delegates to make the most of the next two days by engaging with the program, connecting with colleagues and taking advantage of the many networking opportunities available.

I hope you enjoy AGIC 2026 and wish you a productive and successful conference.

The Australian Oilseeds Federation

The Australian Oilseeds Federation is pleased to continue supporting our industry's flagship event, the Australian Grain Industry Conference, alongside Grain Trade Australia.

This year's conference, "Thriving Today – Resilient Tomorrow", brings together Australian and international perspectives on the opportunities and challenges shaping the grains sector. The program provides an opportunity to explore emerging market and policy developments, consider areas for collaboration, and discuss the practical actions needed to support a competitive and resilient industry. This year also marks the introduction of AGIC Week, expanding the conference into a broader program of industry engagement, international collaboration and networking.

Australia's oilseed industry encompasses a diverse mix of crops, including canola, soybean, sunflower, safflower and cottonseed. Together, these industries supply food, feed and industrial markets, support a range of production systems across Australia, and contribute to the strength and resilience of regional communities.

Canola remains Australia's largest oilseed crop, accounting for the majority of production and export value. Over the past decade, national production has grown significantly, increasing from historical averages of around 3.5 million tonnes to approximately 6.5 million tonnes per annum. In favourable seasons, production has exceeded 8 million tonnes, reinforcing Australia's position as the world's second-largest exporter of canola.

The industry's success is underpinned by strong integration with international markets. Australian canola seed, oil and meal are supplied to customers across Europe and Asia with demand increasingly shaped by food, feed and emerging low-carbon fuel markets. As global market requirements continue to evolve, maintaining market access, demonstrating sustainability credentials and preserving Australia's reputation as a reliable supplier remain key priorities.

Australia's sustainability credentials also remain essential to market access, with increasing participation by both growers and the trade in Sustainable Grain Australia validating the good agricultural practice demonstrated by the canola sector that supports productivity and responsible management of natural capital.

Recognising both the opportunities and changing operating environment, AOF released the Australian Oilseed Industry Strategic Plan 2026–2030 earlier this year. Developed with industry, the Strategy sets a long-term direction for the sector, including an ambition to progress towards 12 million tonnes of annual oilseed production while maintaining the systems, standards and market confidence that have underpinned the industry's growth.

The Strategy focuses on three priorities:

- Market access, market development and demand growth
- Sustainable production and value chains for market assurance
- Industry capability, coordination and delivery

AOF's role is to steward delivery of the Strategy by providing industry leadership, coordinating collective action where appropriate, supporting technical and policy priorities, and representing the interests of the Australian oilseed value chain.

I hope you find this year's AGIC program stimulating and valuable, and that it provides fresh perspectives and connections to help shape the next phase of industry success.

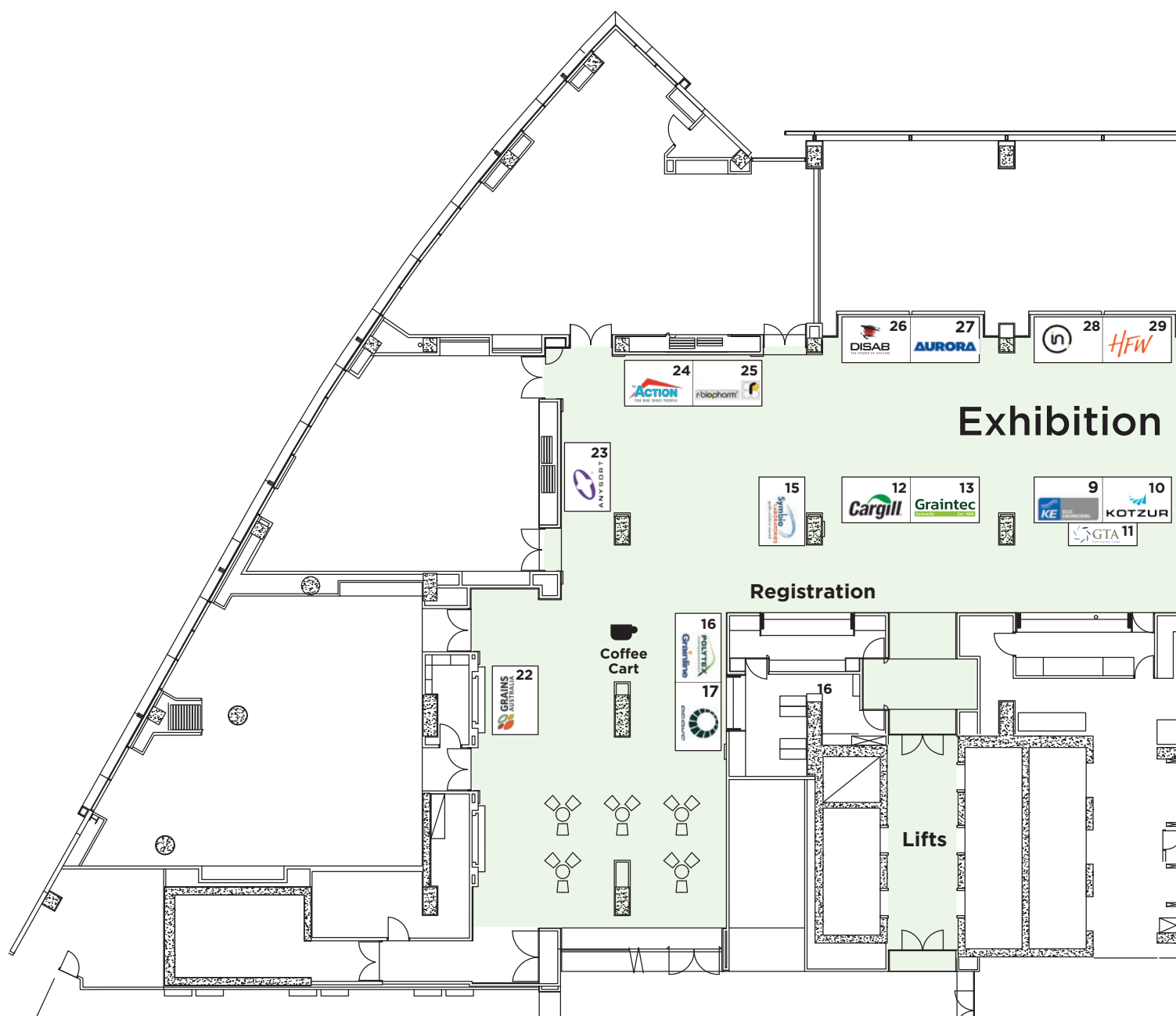
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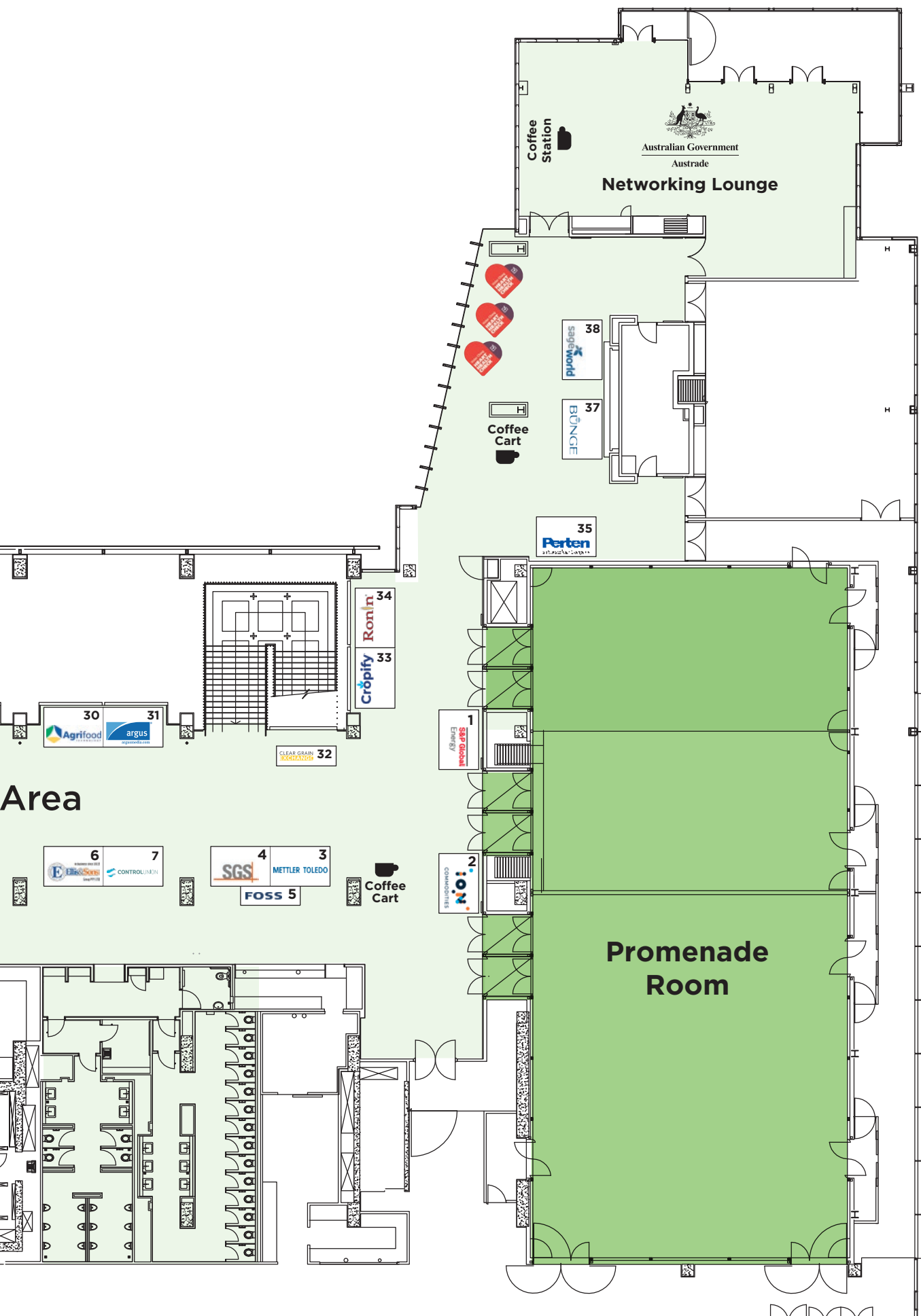
